## Member Story – David Price Finally, A *Fairlady* Z for Susan

A brand new Datsun Z painted in Light Blue Metallic, code 305, first caught Susan's attention in her neighborhood in San Jose, CA, in 1977. The lines were sleek, the profile sporty and she could imagine herself in the driver seat.

Wow, what a car! She liked everything about it. But there was no way a 280Z with a \$6,999 base price fit in the budget for her first car. The deal with her parents was a used car upon graduating high school and attending college. Instead, she chose a used 1973 Opel Manta, also a nice looking 2-door coupe, with an original base price 1/3 of the Z and a used price way, way lower.

The Opel lasted through college and its proceeds funded a Volvo wagon as we started our careers and family. As our family grew she transitioned to mid-sized SUVs; practical and perfect for hauling kids to soccer practice and dogs to the vet, but not vehicles that made her heart pound and satisfied her inner speed freak (though she always pushed every vehicle she owned to its maximum performance).

Automatic transmissions and power windows and remote key fobs and navigation systems and satellite radio were no match for the innate beauty of Nissan's grand touring competitor in the global sports car market, the S30 Fairlady Z, branded a Datsun 280Z for the macho American market. So, every time she caught a wistful glance of one for the next forty-plus years she would again imagine herself behind the wheel, running through the gears with the manual shifter and stepping on the accelerator to demand the

Bosch Jetronic fuel injection rev the 2800cc inline six to near its 5600 rpm, 170 horse max power, divining the perfect time to shift, while turning on a dime aided by the Z's rack and pinion steering, independent suspension, stock sway bar, rear Chapman struts and telescopic dampers. These cars were built to compete and win and they did. But alas, just a dream.

Fast forward to 2020 with the kids grown, graduated from college and starting careers and families of their own; our 34-year, 16 relocations military adventure long in the rear view mirror and fading fast and we made a final move to Sedona for retirement; the only place since 1981 that wasn't chosen by the Navy. Time was now available to revisit those old dream cars we could never afford or use in any practical sense.

We began the search. Some months back we found an extremely low mileage, near-concourse beauty at auction and gamely jumped into the bidding but the price quickly escalated to the Moon. We kept looking. Other S30s came up for sale; 240s and even rare, horsepowerdeprived-by-California 260s but the 280s we saw were modified or rusted or more project than we wanted.

Then, in August 2023 we found a Z to fulfill the 1970s teenager fantasy. Fairlady, as Susan calls her, is a 1977 280Z in Sterling Silver Metallic 306 over a black interior. She rolled off Nissan's Shatai Plant assembly line in Hiratsuka, Kanagawa Prefecture, Japan in February, 1977, with a 4speed manual transmission and optional factory air conditioning, one of just over 56,000 of that model year exported to the USA. Her first owner bought the car in

Avenel, NJ in May, 1977 and babied her for 43 years, keeping her in a garage and putting just over 63,000 miles on the odometer before finally passing her on to the next caretaker.

The car's second owner found, had refurbished and installed a very rare set of Black Pearl Edition alloy wheels from that year. In addition to updating all of the service needs of the car, his improvements included an all new exhaust with a Magnaflow muffler. You should hear this baby roar!

The third owner, a vascular surgeon, serious car guy and all around good dude (gotta love that combo!), further updated the mechanicals on the car with new struts and shifter bushings. She starts and drives as smooth as in 1977. We drove to Wichita, Kansas in our truck camper, arriving to pick her up from the owner on a cloudy Sunday and haul her back to Sedona on a U-Haul trailer. Thunderstorms across the Oklahoma and Texas Panhandles and down to Tucumcari, NM, made sure she was no longer clean and shiny but we did get her back without any new chips or scratches. After op-checking the speed governor on the Ford Powerstroke on I-40, we got her home just two days later, gave her a bath and had her tucked into a slot in the garage by Tuesday evening.

Susan is the fourth owner and has already ordered parts and upholstery to bring *Fairlady* from a high #3 near-survivor (she was repainted in 2013) to a solid #2 for the upcoming car shows. Dave has now added Nissan Motorsports mechanic to his nametag. Look for Susan adding a few miles to the original 65,000 about once each week around Sedona. As Nissan's legendary Yutaka Katayama, father of the Z, counseled,
